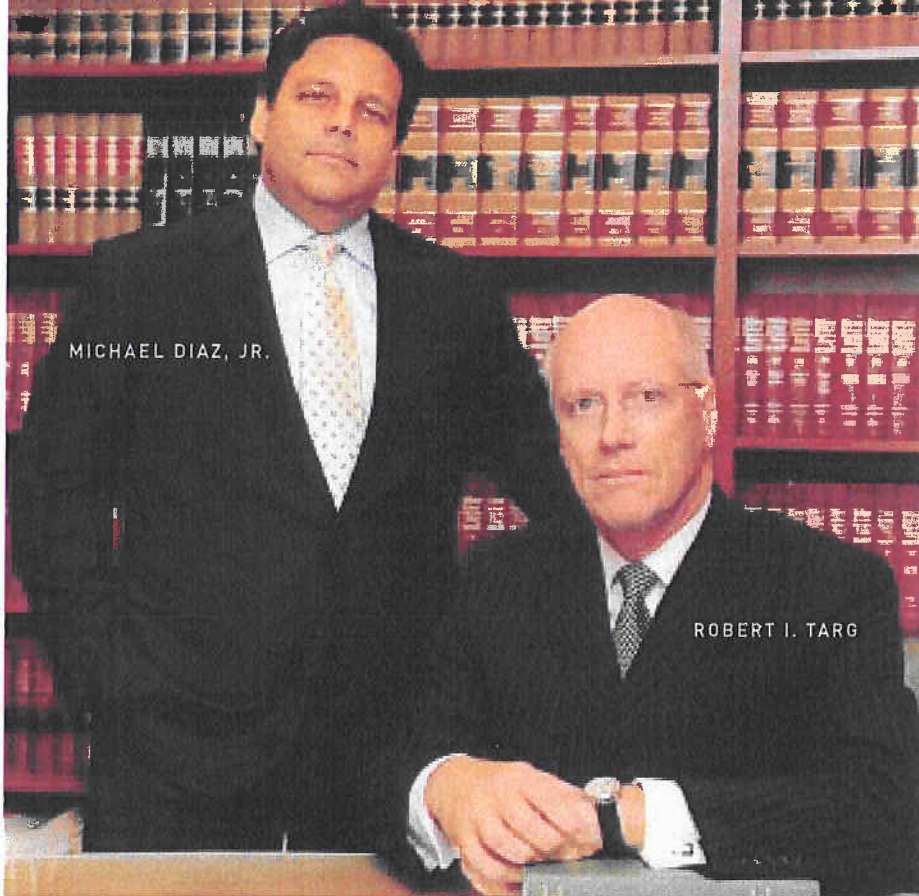

The explosion and emergence of international markets have boosted gains to the global economic community. But some serious drawbacks can accompany these gains.

"If you are a multinational corporation doing business in the Caribbean and the Americas, you have a bull's-eye on you," says Michael Diaz, Jr., founding and managing partner of Diaz, Reus, Rolff & Targ, LLP, a full-service international law firm whose practice areas include international litigation and arbitration, government relations, corporate services and regulatory affairs.

Consider the case of the Costa Rican distributor who sued Canon Latin America Inc. in San José for \$6 million. Diaz, Reus, Rolff & Targ lawyers obtained an anti-suit injunction in the District Court in Miami in favor of Canon on the basis that the distributor had previously agreed to litigate legal disputes in the United States. If the distributor persisted with its foreign action, it would incur sanctions, including jail time.

Because the attorneys had the international know-how to handle the case, they minimized client time and money normally used to research case history. Instead they are making history.

"This is a very, very important case for international commerce in our region," Diaz says. "There is no precedent regarding the issuance of anti-suit injunctions in the U.S. 11th Circuit Court, which includes Alabama, Florida and Georgia."
